
WHAT'S OUR ACCELERATED READER WORD COUNT?

YEAR 6 PRODUCTION - ROCK BOTTOM!


This year, Year 6 will be putting on a production called "Rock Bottom" and we have spent the last few weeks getting to grips with the script and songs.

- More resources required for school trips. We will be planning educational visits for next year and making considerations around transport; we are sure you can appreciate limitations around transport and very much appreciate parental support with this where possible. We will continue to look at creative solutions.
- After school clubs. We will work on developing our extra-curricular clubs and after school club provision to enrich children and support families.

YEAR 3 ROCKS, RELICS AND RUMBLES

Our Year 3 topic this term is Rocks, Relics and Rumbles and Mr Day came to speak to us about some trees he found dating back over one hundred and ten million years when digging out mines in Canada.
