
Thank you FOSS

Update from Rabbit Class



This term Rabbit Class have been learning all about traditional stories. They started the term off by telling the Story of the Runaway Pancake. This was followed by pancake racing and then decorating and eating their own pancakes. Goldilocks was next, and they helped Mummy Bear make some more porridge for Baby Bear. It was fun mixing the porridge and trying it too! The children enjoyed making masks and stick puppets of characters from the story. We also enjoyed the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and planted our own magic beans, built castles and enjoyed role playing the story.

For the 3 Little Pigs we built houses from cereal boxes and practised our cutting skills as we designed outfits for the 3 Pigs. We learnt a song to retell the story, which we enjoyed performing to parents at our reading café. The Gingerbread Man story was good fun! We made story maps in groups to retell the story, designed and made our own Gingerbread men and had to break 6 secret counting codes in order to win a real Gingerbread Man to eat!



We have also been investigating 3D shapes. It has been a very busy but fun term which we ended with learning all about Easter – enjoying our first visit to the church for the Easter service, creating an Easter garden and a flower cross.



Update from Hedgehog Class

On Wednesday 1st March, Hedgehog Class visited The Tower of London. For most children, it was their first experience of travelling by coach and they were really excited by the sights of the London skyline. We explored The Tower and visited the crown jewels and took part in a workshop all about our History topic - The Great Fire of London. We learnt many facts and tried hard to understand what it would have been like to be alive in 1666!

These gave us lots of wonderful ideas which helped to design our Morph sculpture and he is really starting to take shape now. A huge thank you to Mrs Bond for all her support. What have our Otters been up to

In Year 2 we have been super artists this term! They have looked at the artist Henri Rousseau and Vincent Van Gogh and studied their techniques and styles to create their own pieces. They created group pictures in the style of Henri Rousseau, using a variety of materials to layer up the background to their jungle pictures before adding animals as a final touch. For their starry night pictures, everyone had a section to complete and using different shades of blue and thin paintbrushes, they used small brushstrokes to mimic Van Gogh's style to create a whole class picture. Some of them created individual pieces in their own time using pencils.



Our class book this term has been 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Drew Daywalt. We have written rhyming and list poems about different colours and shades, written descriptive writing and wrote a letter to Duncan (the boy from the book) to try and persuade him to choose us as his favourite colour. We create our own pages in the style of the book and created a whole class display based on our incredible art work and writing!

We also had fun doing our Learn to ride experience. The children had the opportunity to learn how to ride a bike and sharpen their skills for those that could already ride. The children had a great time and confidence grew throughout.



Lots of fun in Fox Class

On Monday 27th March 2023, Fox Class took part in a fantastic art day, in preparation for the St George's Day Parade in Gravesend next month. They worked with a local artist, using natural materials to create a stallion to ride down the High Street! Fox Class learnt how to manipulate willow branches and fix them together to create a frame, which was then covered in a special type of tissue paper and PVA glue to bring their horses to life. In the afternoon they set to work to create armour and a helmet, following instructions carefully step by step, to transform ourselves into St George.

Easter Service



Pupil Attendance

Improving pupil attendance is a key priority here at Shorne. We are committed to supporting children and families to ensure every child meets their potential and can flourish.

Whilst we understand that there are some instances where children are unable to attend school, where it is possible, children should be in school benefiting from the academic, social, emotional, moral, spiritual, cultural and personal development opportunities that we offer here at Shorne.

When can my child be absent from school?

When you register your child at school, you have a legal duty to ensure your child attends that school regularly. This means that your child must attend every day that the school is open, unless:

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- Your child is too ill to attend that day.
 - You have asked in advance and been given permission by the school for your child to be absent on that day due to exceptional circumstances.
 - Your child cannot attend school on that day because it is a day you are taking part in religious observance.
 - Your local authority is responsible for arranging your child's transport to school and it is not available on that day or has not been provided yet; or
 - You are a gypsy/traveller family with no fixed abode, and you are required to travel for work that day meaning your child cannot attend their usual school.

In most circumstances, however, your child is required to attend another school temporarily during such absences.

These are the only circumstances where schools can permit your child to be absent. Please visit our website for our Attendance Policy, and you can access the most up-to-date information about your child's attendance on Arbor.

Medical reminder

Thank you all for keeping your child's details up to date on Arbor by adding new conditions and also removing ones they no longer suffer from. A polite reminder that we are unable to administer prescribed medication if given three times per day. We can only do so, if prescribed four times per day and the necessary paperwork has been completed. Please ensure any Epipens and Inhalers required by your child are in school at all times and expired ones are replaced. At no time, should a child have any medication on themselves in school ie paracetamol, calpol, creams etc. This also applies to suntan lotions.

Many thanks for your assistance as always.

We now have a Family Liaison Officer - Mrs Reason - who is very happy and able to support families in many ways, including in relation to pupil attendance.






Gardening Club
