Rabbit Class Round Up







This term Rabbit Class have been learning all about different journeys. They started off visiting Kenya and following Handa on her journey to Akeyo's village. The naughty animals stole all the fruit in Handa's basket. They enjoyed making large cardboard box animals from the story and made labelled hats full of fruit and retold the story by creating storymaps.

In maths we have been learning about money and using coins of different values to pay for objects. We had a shop in Rabbit Class where we could practise using money for real, buying biscuits, sweets and stickers.



Mrs Thornley and Mrs Bond are incredibly proud of Rabbit Class and how much they have achieved in their first year of school.

We went on a journey under the sea and enjoyed writing poems about what we spied through our masks and snorkels. We had great fun making sea creatures and learning all about the dangers of plastic in our oceans. Following on from under the sea we enjoyed the story of 'The Lighthouse Keepers Picnic.' We made our own picnic lunch for Mr Grinling as the greedy seagulls had eaten his! We also had fun designing picnic bags to send down a zipwire to reach the lighthouse.





Update from Hedgehog Class

This term Year 1 have been doing lots of outdoor learning and making the most of the nicer weather. We have enjoyed going to forest school, having fun in the mud kitchen and riding around on the bikes.





We were also incredibly fortunate to have Atilla spend some time talking to us about Islam. He brought in many of the special items he uses every day. He showed us how Muslim's pray and how important this is to them. Awe-inspiring stuff.

In our PSHE topic of 'Changing Me' we looked at how the children have changed since they were babies. The children brought in baby photos of themselves from home and we played a game of 'Guess who the baby is' which they thoroughly enjoyed.



What have Otter Class been up to?



As part of the geography topic Australia, the children researched different native animals such as wombats, koalas, emus, platypus and sugar gliders. They made triarama (3D information posters) about their favourite Australian animals and wrote their favourite facts about them.



As part of science week, Year 2 investigated the impact plastic is having on our oceans. We found out that we use lots of single-use plastics and they are not biodegradable, which means they can stay in the ground for hundreds of years! To link with our geography topic of Australia, we wanted to find out how the plastic is impacting the plants and animals that live on the Great Barrier Reef. Using recycled bottle tops (which Year 2 classes have been using since 2020!) we made a bottle top underwater picture to remind everyone in our school to dispose of the plastic properly, recycle where possible and try to avoid using single-use plastics.

DID YOU KNOW?

Every year, 8 million tons of plastic gets into the ocean - a humpback whales weight 1 ton so that's the same weight as 8 million hump back whales!





Fox Class fun!

What a wonderful term for Year 3! We have loved learning about the Vikings in our History lessons. We learnt about Viking beliefs and conflict before learning about longships and why they were so good for raiding! We then created our own longships out of plastic bottles (recylced of course!), designing shields, dragon heads and sails to decorate our boats.




Update from Dolphin Class
