DID YOU KNOW ?

- 90% attendance equals half a day of school missed every week
- One school year at 90% attendance = 4 whole weeks of lessons and schoolwork missed
- Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS2, 83.9% achieved the expected standard compared to 40.2% of pupils who were persistently absent.

The national target for pupil attendance is 96%. As a school, our current overall attendance so far this year is 95.5%.

Hedgehogs

This term Hedgehog Class have produced wonderful pieces of writing. We have been reading the story, What the Ladybird Heard by Julia Donaldson. The story inspired us to go on sound hunts around the school and then write our own stories called, What the Ladybird Heard at Shorne School!

Following this, the children learnt about the features of non-fiction texts and created some exciting leaflets - All About the Farm.

In art we have been studying Paul Cezanne and using his techniques and water colours, we recreated his painting - Still life with apples and oranges from 1895.



In Year 2 this term we have been looking at the story of Dread Cat by Michael Rosen. We created missing posters, sorry letters to the mice and even rewrote a chapter from the book to make it even better! We also had the opportunity to draw our own version of Dread Cat!



Foxes




This term Year 3 has been reading 'A Bear Called Paddington'! We have thoroughly enjoyed using it as a stimulus for our writing. One of our extended pieces of writing was to write a set of instructions to tell our readers how to make Paddington's favourite food, a marmalade sandwich! We followed instructions carefully to make our own which we were able to take home and enjoy!



We have also been looking at Astronomical art. We learnt about the history of this style of art and used visual language to discuss how pieces of art, which depicted the future, made us feel. We then created our own space pictures!

Year 6 have packed a lot into this term including some interactive learning in science about both the circulatory system and sound - we even made our own pan pipes to experiment with pitch.
