

Hedgehog Class have been very busy this term. We have experienced an exciting school trip to the Tower of London and we have been working hard in class on our writing.





We have enjoyed the class story books this term, in particular they have been inspired by **The Funny Bones** story. **The Funny Bones** story inspired us to write a Wanted Poster and our very own Funny Bones stories too. Hedgehog Class have also been investigating different structures in their D.T lessons - their understanding of different frames and bases helped them to create successful marble runs!

#### **Otters**

This term in Year 2 our class book has been The Day the Crayons Quit by Drew Daywalt. We loved reading about the different colours' feelings and how they were annoyed with their owner Duncan! We wrote our own letters to Duncan, persuading him to choose us as his favourite colour.





In art we have been studying the artist Georgie O'Keeffe who is an American artist that paints flowers really close up so you can admire their beauty. Using paint, we created our own versions of some of her paintings and we went around the school taking photos of real flowers which we then created our own versions of using oil pastels.

As part of science week, we recorded the temperature at the same time every day to observe the change over time. Most days it was between 13-15 degrees but one afternoon it was 20!

#### **Tiger Class**



Year 6 have completed a lot of practical activities this term before our big final push towards SATS after Easter. In DT we contributed significantly to the devastation of the rainforests with our consumption of cardboard in order to complete our arched structures and make marble runs! We have also carried out some investigations in science, considering how moths have adapted and thinking about how components are affected by changes in a circuit.

#### **Dolphin Class**



Year 4 had a wonderful time this term. We have spent lots of time looking at C.S. Lewis's 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe'.

During Science week, we conducted an experiment to look at the effect of different liquids on the shell of an egg. We had a brilliant time tracking what was happening and were very shocked to see the effects the vinegar had on the egg - creating a 'rubber-like' egg!
