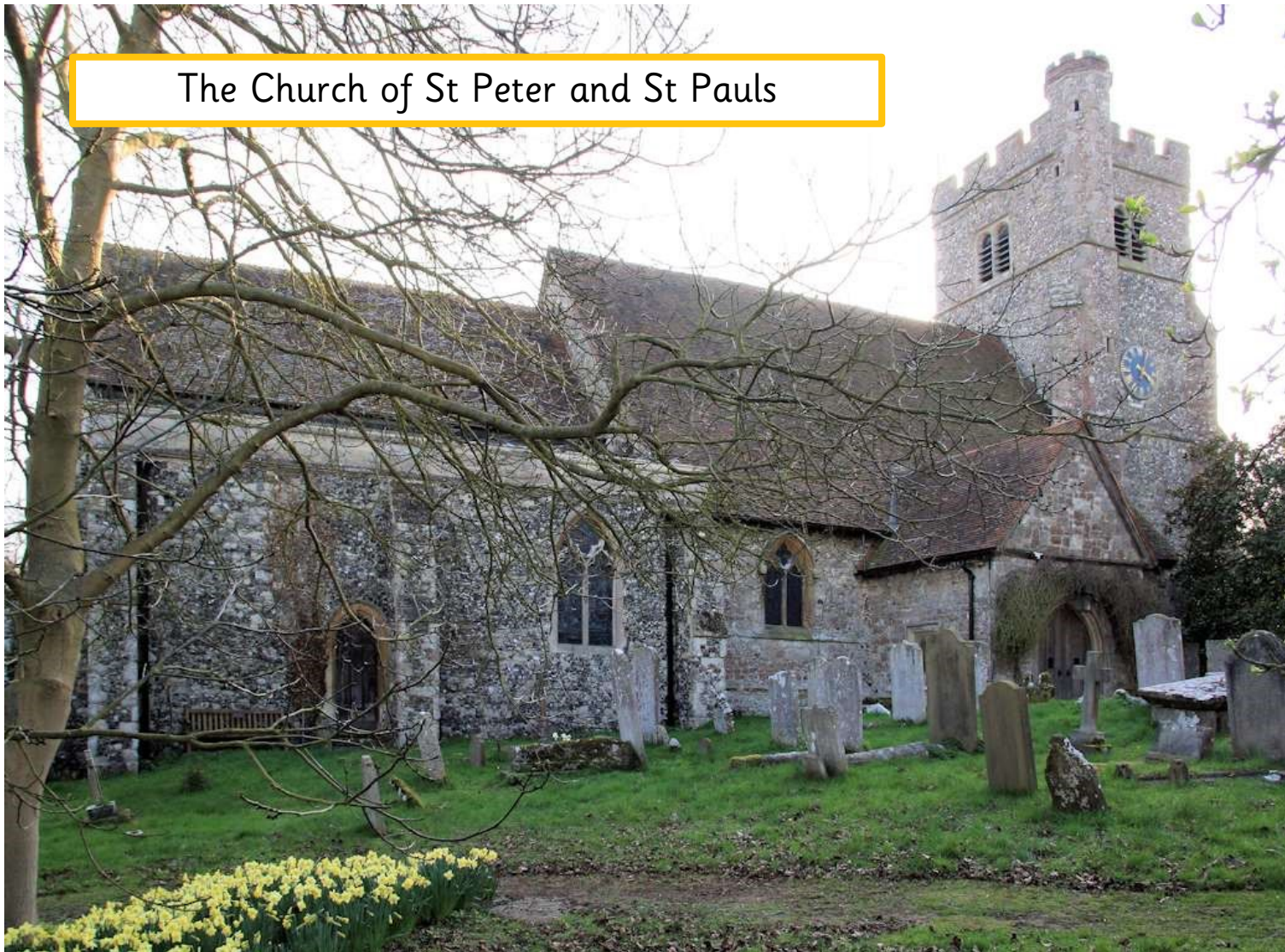

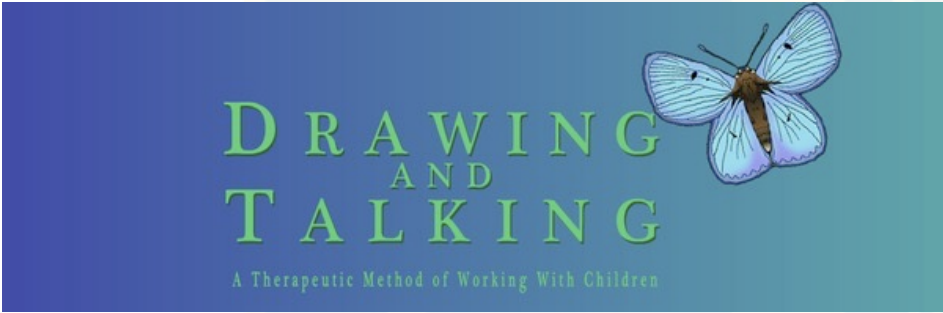

- Below 96% - support system in place
- Below 90% - persistent absence = serious concern
- Be on time

30 minutes late each day	19 days lost!

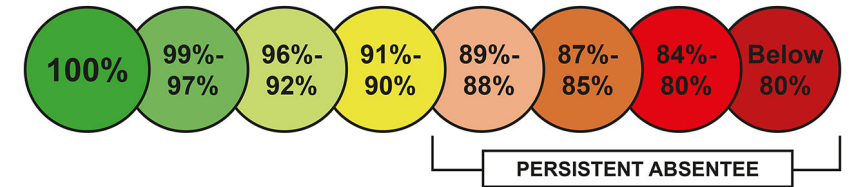


Absence
