Get to know our Head Teacher Miss Hewett in the first of our new feature -Shorne Spotlight! Here are five things you may not know about her!





Additionally, we were introduced to Boccia, which is an inclusive sport featured in the Paralympics. Overall, it's been an enriching and enjoyable start to the year!




#### **Dolphin Class**




Early in the term they produced some super descriptive writing and have recently written informative biographies to support our learning in Black History Month.
