Goodbye Harley - enjoy your retirement!



Hedgehogs



Term 6 has been packed full of exciting learning in Hedgehog Class! The children have been observing the growth of a sunflower plant from seed through to a mature plant as part of their science lessons. Everyone got to plant their own seed and watch them sprout into a seeding and then grow taller with larger leaves. The children learned that the seed needed water, sunlight and warmth to grow, this lovely weather has certainly helped! The plants have now gone home to continue growing in the children's gardens, hopefully a beautiful sunflower will bloom soon and new seeds will be produced.





In English, we have enjoyed reading the book 'The Colour Monster'. The children created their own puppets and acted out the story to the rest of the class. This helped them to write their own versions of the story.

Otters 👞

We have had a very fun and creative time in Otters this term, from learning about pictograms, positional and directional language. In science we have been learning about different forces and enjoyed carrying out our experiment to test friction, as well as exploring magnets.

During our PE lessons the children learnt how to attack and be a defender - the children then applied this to a team game situation where they had to defend their treasure, whilst trying to attack another team to steal theirs.









For DT, we have been learning about mechanisms, particularly focussing on wheels and axels. The Children looked at existing products and how wheels and axels work. We then practised our cutting and joining skills, planned our car before the making and evaluating process.



It has been a wonderful Term 6 in Year 3, filled with creativity, fun, and memorable experiences.






Tiger Class
