




In Art, we had a fantastic time studying L.S. Lowry's artwork, "Return to Work."

We have had lots of active maths learning, using our orienteering course to help us to consolidate our learning on place value, Roman numerals and times tables.

The children said "We really enjoy this. It helps us to get our energy out and helps us to learn our times tables."

In science, we explored different rocks, looking at their colour, the particles that could be seen and how hard or soft they were. Then we used chocolate, applying pressure and heat to learn how sedimentary, metamorphic and igneous rocks are formed.



#### **Tiger Class**

The children have settled very well into the new routines and expectations of year 6. They have embraced their new roles and responsibilities: from buddies to **librarians**, everyone is busy and involved in contributing to our wider school community.



We have been able to link some of our learning this term which has meant the children have been quite engrossed in Victorian Britain through their history, English and reading lessons.

They have learned about life for Victorian children - the living conditions, expectations to work and differences in education have been a real eye-opener, giving the children the opportunity to reflect on how lucky and privileged we are now. I hope you all have an enjoyable half-term break and come back refreshed and ready for the madness of the Christmas term!

#### **Year 5 Pandas**

Year 5 have had an amazing first term back!
In English, we've been using Kensuke's Kingdom as our stimulus. The children have explored modal verbs to create detailed survival guides and used emotive language to write diary entries from Michael's perspective. They've thoroughly enjoyed reading and engaging with this exciting and heartwarming story.





We've also had a very creative term. In Design and Technology, we began learning about motors and how they work in preparation for building our very own motorised cars next term!

In Art, we focused on architecture and the inspirational

work of Zaha Hadid, who is famous for her curved, emotionally powerful buildings. We explored value and shape, learning how to use light and shading to draw 3D forms. They we designed our own drawings using imaginative and dynamic shapes.
