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A message from Miss Hewett

Although this has been a short term, it has certainly been a very busy one. Across the school, children have taken part in a wide range of enriching experiences, including swimming across different year groups, netball tournaments, school trips, and our Year 6 charity event.

We have also welcomed visitors to support our learning around recycling and sustainability, alongside our Plastic Free initiatives, helping to raise environmental awareness across the school. It has been wonderful to see the continued development of the Peace Garden, which has come directly from pupil voice.

Parent consultations provided valuable opportunities to share children's progress and next steps, and we have continued to strengthen our links with the local community, working closely with Father Clive and Father Michael.

Looking ahead, we are currently exploring the introduction of Smart School Council, following a visit to one of our Trust schools. This will enable all children to have a voice in decision-making across the school. We are also researching the possibility of establishing a girls' football club—if anyone in our community would be interested in supporting or leading this, please do get in touch.

As a senior leadership team, we continue to strive for ongoing improvements, including plans to further develop and enhance our playground provision. As we come to the end of the term, it has been wonderful to see the care, kindness and determination shown by our children across all areas of school life. Moments like these reflect the spirit of our community and the way in which children support one another every day.

We are incredibly proud of our children for the way they contribute positively to our school and to each other. Thank you to our staff, parents and wider community for your continued support throughout the term. We wish you all a happy, peaceful and restful Easter break.

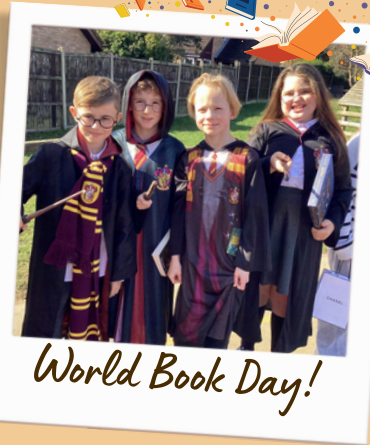

Football

The Year 5 and 6 boys have had another busy and successful term, also competing in the O'Reilly Shield. With both a quarter-final and semi-final to play, the team knew there was plenty of hard work ahead. First up was an away trip to Kings Farm. We started sluggishly and found ourselves 1-0 down within the first five minutes. However, the boys quickly recognised that the conditions were not suited to dribbling past players, but instead perfectly matched our excellent pass-and-move style of football. Harry led the way with a superb hat-trick, while Charlie added another two goals. With the game all but won, we did concede a late penalty, but this was expertly saved by Ellis to secure a fantastic 5-1 victory and send us into the semi-final.

We now move into the final, where we will face either Riverview B Team or New Ash Green. Details of the match will be shared as soon as we know them, and it would be fantastic to have as much support there as possible.

The semi-final saw us face St George's. The game started slowly but after a few changes at the start of the second quarter, combined with some excellent teamwork and passing, we soon found ourselves 2-0 up thanks to goals from Sidney and Oliver. The second half was where we really turned the screw. The boys produced some outstanding football and added another five goals through Jon, Harry J, Sidney, Charlie and a Jacob penalty. The team showed exceptional work rate, determination and togetherness throughout, scoring some truly wonderful team goals that had both the supporters and the opposition applauding.

All children have been given a bear template to decorate over the Easter holidays. We would like pupils to come up with a design which represents Shorne Primary School and our school values.

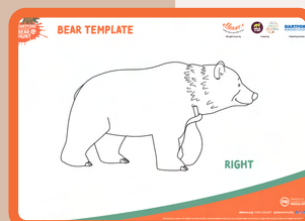
You can use colouring pencils, pens, crayons or paint – and be as creative as possible. A winning design from each class will be used to inspire our final Cub sculpture.

The children especially loved reading **Naked Mole Rat Gets Dressed** and writing diary entries about Wilbur in English.

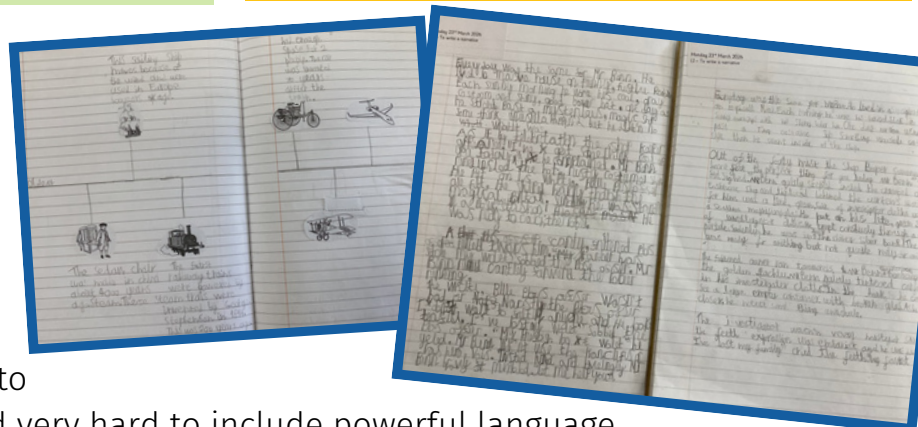


A highlight this term was rehearsing our parts for the Easter service. I think everyone will agree that the children did a fantastic job bringing this important story to life!

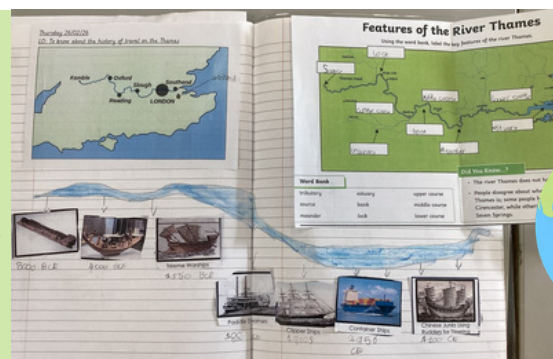
Otters

Year 2 have had a very busy term! In English, we have been using the classic tale of **'Mr Benn'**. The children have tried so hard with this unit of writing, and the final outcome was very impressive. They have worked hard to include expanded noun phrases, adverbs and conjunctions to add detail to sentences. They also worked very hard to include powerful language.

In maths we have worked on multiplication and division and they are very competitive on TTRS. In history we have been learning about the history of transport through the ages, how the invention of boats and trains have had an impact on our lives today.



Geography has now zoomed into the United Kingdom and the capital cities. For our religious studies, we have been learning about the easter and why we celebrate it.





Year 3 have had a fun-filled Term 4 and what a fantastic term it has been! We have loved creating some wonderful medicines inspired by Roald Dahl, using our imaginations to come up with some truly marvellous ideas.
